Grant of 2nd Renewal of Permission to Maharana Pratap Ayurvedic Medical College, Ishwariganj, Baikunthpur, Kanpur Nagar, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0834) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Maharana Pratap Ayurvedic Medical College, Ishwariganj, Baikunthpur, Kanpur Nagar, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0834) inspection was conducted on 24.03.2025 and 25.03.2025 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process the 2nd renewal of permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024 ", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

i). Teaching staff: -

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} x 100\% = \frac{15}{17} x 100\% = 88.23\%$ (Including Visitors observation and Excluding Excess) Shortcomings in teaching staff are as under:-

iv). Functionality of the hospital:-

a) Average bed occupancy percentage is 46.54%. (Shortcoming of 3.46%)

v). Other Observations:-

- a) CoA:- Not Submitted for 2025-26.
- 3. Further, an opportunity of clarification vide letter even no. dated 17.07.2025 was provided to you. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide ref no. MPAMC/H/2025/198 Dated 19.07.2025. The submitted documents were verified & found complying.
- 4. Further, the assessment report along with clarification was duly placed before the 136th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 24.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for Extended Permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as the 1st Renerwal of Permission was issued to the college for the academic year 2024-25. Hence, the Board decided to issue 2nd Renewal of Permission in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

 Therefore, Maharana Pratap Ayurvedic Medical College, Ishwariganj, Baikunthpur, Kanpur Nagar, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0834) is hereby granted with:-

2nd Renewal of Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;

- 6. The aforementioned permission is issued under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - I. It is informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards

as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- **9.** Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10. You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
- 11. The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 30th November, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2
- **12.** The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of 3rd batch of students in the 1st professional BAMS is made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
- **13.** The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time in accordance with the Regulation (66) of MESAR 2024 which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- **14.** The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the renewal of permission for the academic session 2026-27.
